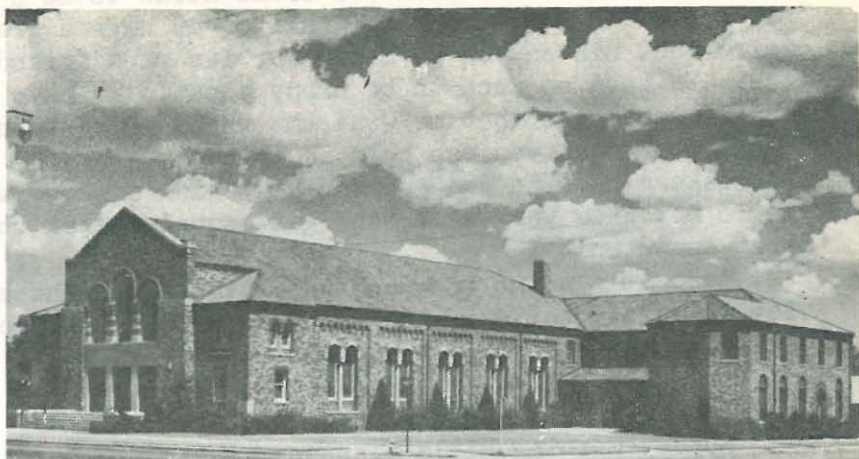

We continue to make daily visits among the students of our Bible course and others whom we know. . . We are always mindful of you brethren in our prayers, giving thanks to the Lord for your continued interest and fellowship in the spread of the Word of God among the Italian people. We hope and pray that through our mutual efforts many more souls may 'taste that the Lord is good' and that His name shall be glorified more abundantly. We ask that special prayers be offered in behalf of Bro. Cline that whatever is best for the Lord's work will be done the next few days."

BRO. McCLUNG STATES that he is really glad to be back home and to once more get into the midst of his work. "I never knew before making this trip how much we Americans have to be thankful for and what a blessing it is to be in a land where truth is known and can be preached to others."
